

GUIS Parents Involvement & Parental Engagement Policy

Purpose

GEMS believes in assisting all our students to reach their full potential. We see our parents as central to that aspiration and seek to give them the information, tools and resources to help their children be the best they can be. GEMS understands that positive interaction between school and home are vital to a child's development and education. We provide a variety of parent programmes aimed at enhancing the relationship between parents, children and the school.

All GEMS Schools will develop engagement activities tailored to meet the needs of their community. Key to these are the following expectations:

- We recognise parents as central to the teaching and learning process
- We inform parents of student study programmes in advance so that they can discuss these with their children and support them where necessary
- Our teachers will provide tools, resources and guidance which can help parents to support their children's learning
- We promote and provide a number of face to face contact opportunities with teachers during a school year in which the child's progress is discussed and how parents can support further progress
- We support a parents' association which will help the school spread best practice to other parents on helping their children learn at home
- We regularly promote the GEMS' parent website, which has lots of information and tips and resources both on parenting and supporting learning in the home
- Our parents promise to support and engage with their child's learning reflected in the Home-School Agreement.

Parent Relationship Programmes may include:

- Information seminars / curriculum meetings
- Regular teacher / parent consultations.
